Job Description

Background information:

<u>Breathe Arts Health Research</u> (Breathe) is a multi-award winning not-for-profit social enterprise. Breathe design and deliver creative programmes, underpinned by scientific research, to improve health and wellbeing. Our work is co-designed with artists, scientists, healthcare staff and patients, to meet specific clinical needs. We deliver a diverse range of participatory programmes and live performance events across a range of art forms including dance, music, visual art, poetry and magic. Breathe's innovative and artistic approach to transforming healthcare experiences, offer those we work with, a sense of empowerment, hope and creative fulfilment when they need it most. Breathe has won a wide range of awards, tenders and commissions and have contributed to medical journals/book chapters/government guidance. We are proud to be one of the first arts and health companies to be recognised by NHS England for our work.

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Job Summary:

The **Project Manager, Breathe Sing for Lung Health Warwickshire** is a freelance role within Breathe and made possible by funding from Warwickshire County Council. The project is in its second year, with current funding running until September 2023. This project forms part of research being conducted by Coventry University into the effectiveness of various creative health interventions and reaches people living with respiratory conditions (including Long Covid) across Warwickshire.

Breathe Sing aims to improve lung health and help manage symptoms through physical warm-ups, vocal exercise and group singing. Led by a trained Singing Leader, songs from around the world are specially selected to support breath control and ease symptoms of breathlessness. Warm up activities help participants with their posture, and challenge them physically as well as cognitively, but in a beneficial way.

This role will mainly be focussed on scoping, design and delivery of our first in-person Breathe Sing for Lung Health programmes in Warwickshire scheduled to take place between March 2023 and September 2023. It also includes responsibility for the remaining delivery and evaluation of an online version of the programme that ends in March 2023.

The Project Manager must be highly organised, with excellent timeline and logistical management skills, an eye for detail, excellent communication skills and a passion for arts. The candidate must be highly professional, personable, kind and empathetic, with the ability to engage with a range of stakeholders including vulnerable adults, healthcare professionals, artists and core staff. The Project Manager will work closely with our Head of Scalability throughout the contract and obtain information and advice from colleagues already working on this and our London-based Breathe Sing for Lung Health programme.

Responsibilities:

Contract Management & Monitoring

- Maintain strong relationships with the key stakeholders at Warwickshire County Council and Coventry University
- Regularly collate evaluation and monitoring data, producing quarterly reports
- Attend quarterly reporting meetings with key stakeholders
- Work to the agreed contract budget, overseen by Head of Scalability

Programme Coordination

• Implement detailed administration processes (using existing systems including Capsule & Trello) to ensure a smooth delivery model is in place; registration process, monitoring, data collection and evaluation

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- Generate, oversee and monitor a programme timeline which considers planning, recruitment, delivery and evaluation – ensuring all programmes run to set timescales
- Gain a comprehensive understanding and knowledge base of respiratory/ chest conditions, the benefits of singing and the existing research behind this area of work. Use this knowledge to help develop the programme of work
- Maintain, establish and nurture strong relationships with local healthcare staff, patient groups, arts providers and other relevant programme leaders and networks, including the Coventry and Warwickshire Creative Health Alliance and UK-wide Singing for Lung Health network
- Refer to project scoping already conducted on existing singing for health groups, geography and needs of the local area
- Implement taster sessions to engage healthcare professionals, local service users and commissioners
- Recruit local, Warwickshire based Singing Leaders to the programme where possible, ensuring they are trained in Singing for Lung Health via the <u>Musical</u> <u>Breath</u>
- Write and issue contracts for Singing Leaders delivering on the project
- Liaise with Breathe's Company Administrator to ensure DBS checks are completed for all delivery team
- Generate and keep up-to-date Risk Assessments for all programme delivery for both online and in-person programmes
- Assist with the coordination and development of funding applications to secure the future of the programme in Warwickshire

Activity Delivery

- Administer online sessions on Zoom and ensure online safeguarding procedures are adhered to
- Secure suitable and affordable spaces to host in-person Breathe Sing for Lung Health programmes, developing strategic and meaningful partnerships where possible
- Distribute end of programme 'package' compiling signposting information, further information about supporting Breathe AHR, distributing 'keep sakes' (e.g. Note card), setting up WhatsApp groups as appropriate
- Develop strong, open communications with participants; setting up regular text reminders for sessions, phone call follow up when required, answering any queries or concerns
- Build strong working relationships with Singing Leaders including post session feedback
- Monitor all session attendance

Communications

• Continue to implement and develop existing recruitment strategy for the programme, either via referrals from key stakeholder contacts in healthcare or via an open recruitment call through Breathe social media channels and website.

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• Collaborate with our Communications Manager to help document the project with participant case studies, social media content, film and photography

Finance & Governance

- Follow Breathe's financial procedures at all times
- Ensure artist contracts are adhered to at all times e.g. cancellation policy
- Adhere to Breathe's GDPR Policy, ensuring all participant data is collated and secured safely
- Understand and adhere to all Breathe's Policies and Procedures, taking particular focus to Breathe's rigorous Safeguarding Policy
- Ensuring all sessions are a safe space for participants and artists and noting safeguarding concerns immediately as and when they arise and following Breathe's Safeguarding procedure as necessary
